That means more women than ever before are receiving life-transforming care. Thank you!

In November 2024, Fistula Foundation was named as a 2024 Holiday Impact Prize Winner by Nicholas Kristof, a twotime Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist for *The New York Times*. The annual Prize celebrates organizations working to make the world a better place. Fistula Foundation was one of just three 2024 honorees, chosen out of 1.8 million nonprofits in the U.S.






The Compassion Behind the Care

Ava Yung devoted herself to helping others—with genuine kindness, warmth, and sincerity. In her final years, Ava suffered from a rare neurological disorder that left her incontinent and unable to control her body. Her son Ken, who cared for her, witnessed the isolation and the loss of independence this brought. Ava's experience echoed the suffering of women in far less resourced places. In her memory, Ken chose to honor Ava's spirit of hard work and perseverance with a transformative gift to Fistula Foundation from the inheritance Ava left him. "I hope that my mother's gift can help those in need, relieve them from suffering and give them a better life," said Ken.



A message from Kate:

No Woman Left Behind is in many ways a love letter to people like you who have made our story possible. Since this is the last annual report I'll be a part of, I thought it would be fitting to end with an excerpt from the final page of my book.

> Every day life asks each of us: what kind of person am I? I believe our answer is shown in how we treat other people. Our donors' selfless empathy is the rocket fuel that drives everything we do. I am inspired by the countless people who give amounts large and small to help women they will never meet, in places they will likely never visit, get their lives back. We share a reverence for the courage of women with fistula, who against the odds, persevere to emerge the heroes in their own story as their despair is turned into hope and healing. I feel so lucky to spend my days surrounded by such compassion and courage.

A woman with fistula is like you and me—she is someone's daughter, sister, wife, aunt, or friend. She wants what you'd want for yourself—a healthy future. Her story is unique and her own. Her struggles are deeply personal. And yet, there is one element that is often the same: surgery provides a hardwon opportunity for a new life—a rebirth. But the promise of curative surgery is a dream for far too many women. It doesn't have to be this way. Together we can create a world where no woman suffers needlessly for trying to bring a child into the world. My hope is that you'll join us in our efforts to ensure that every woman injured in childbirth gets the care she needs to thrive, so that there is no woman left behind.
