






Meeting the Moment

When the pandemic hit, our partners in Africa and Asia faced an exceptional challenge. While we have always been laser-focused on fistula treatment, we knew we needed to act quickly to help them weather the storm. So, with unanimous support from our Board of Directors, we amended our Articles of Incorporation to launch a Covid-19 Emergency Response Fund in April 2020. Thanks to you, in 2020, we provided nearly \$700,000 in aid.



When Peninah arrived for fistula treatment at Gynocare Kisii, our partner hospital in Kenya, she was showing signs of Covid-19. Thanks to your generosity, our partners had the equipment they needed to help. Hospital staff took precautions and isolated Peninah for two weeks before she received successful fistula repair surgery.



An Astonishing Rebound

After a sharp drop in surgeries in the second quarter, our partners finished the year strong, exceeding fistula treatment at pre-pandemic levels in the fourth quarter of 2020.



You Helped Provide 6,833 Surgeries in 2020

In Q2, fistula surgeries decreased by nearly two-thirds compared to 2019. However, in an astounding rebound, Q4 surgery numbers were nearly 13% higher than those reported at the same time in 2019, a very encouraging trend!



Each Surgery Represents a Woman Like Musabimana

Musabimana lives in a rural village in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). She was scheduled for surgery in early 2020 by HEAL Africa, our trusted partner hospital, but the Covid-19 pandemic made traveling impossible. However, our doctors on the ground refused to give up on her. As soon as it was safe, they arranged for her to come to the hospital for life-transforming surgery. Musabimana was discharged in November 2020, completely dry!



Proven Partners, Proven Strategy

For more than a decade, we have been helping our partners build in-country capacity for fistula care across Africa and Asia. During the pandemic, this strategy has paid off. As soon as conditions on the ground allowed, our partner hospitals were ready and eager to resume fistula treatment.

Small Business Owner in Texas Honors Her Family by Giving Back



Nasim Bell is the owner of the Hummingbird Tea Room in The Woodlands, Texas. She first heard about Fistula Foundation many years ago on the Oprah Show, and since then, she has dedicated a portion of proceeds from her business to helping women with obstetric fistula. "Most of our support comes from women, and it's only fitting [for us] to give to an organization that helps women globally," she said.

Sadly, Nasim's parents passed away from Covid-19 in August 2020. To honor them, Nasim now also gives as an individual, sponsoring women's surgeries in their memory.




